The primary subject will be a proposal suggesting a study should be sponsored by the 3 counties, Snohomish, King and Pierce, to explore the "Proposal of High Capacity Puget Sound Regional Monorail Master Plan (PSRMM)". The proposal outlines a monorail plan for the 3 counties that has the potential of moving 500,000 passengers daily. To relieve the horrendous traffic problems experienced in Puget Sound and most other high density areas in the U.S., we have to look into less costly and more efficient alternatives, such as the Urbanaut[®], a new high tech monorail that has great flexibility in planning and operation, and is scheduled to be manufactured in South Korea.

Urbanaut[®] Company's recommendation is that the many transportation agencies in the region should be joined together to form a "super-agency" that openly considers less costly alternative technologies to solve and improve the regions transportation problems.
